

ADVENTURES ALL YEAR LONG

POTTERS FALLS

36° 04.936°N 84° 34.570°W

From Hwy 27N in Wartburg, turn left onto Kingston Street. In approximately .5 miles, Kingston Street will turn into Potters Falls Road. Proceed approximately 2.5 miles until you reach Potters Falls Bridge. Parking is permitted on either side before crossing the bridge.



Upper Potters Falls is just below the bridge to the left. Follow the path about .3 miles to Lower Potters Falls, also to the left.

The two falls provide a great place to picnic and swim on a hot summer day.

DEBORD FALLS / EMORY GAP FALLS

From Frozen Head State Park, park at the Panther Branch trailhead. Cross the concrete bridge, go up Panther Branch Trail .55 miles. To the right you will see a trail leading to Debord Falls. The trail veers to the right to an overlook view of the falls. To the left, stairs descend to the base of the falls for an "up close" view.

After enjoying Debord Falls, proceed back to Panther Branch Trail and follow the trail to the right. In about .25 miles, Panther Branch Trail bears right and down hill, stay left on Emory Gap Trail for .5 miles. At the end of Emory Gap Trail, you'll be greeted by Emory Gap Falls, an 18' plunge waterfall.

Upper & Lower Melton MILL FALLS

These falls can be accessed via the Bridge Trail at Lilly Bluff, Obed Wild & Scenic River. While unmarked, the path to the falls is well worn and easily identified. Bridge Trail is .5 miles one way and rated moderate to strenuous. At the top of the trail, be sure to take in the overlook immediately to the right for a gorgeous view of the Obed Wild & Scenic River.

Morgan County is honored to be home to Obed Wild & Scenic River, Big South Fork National River & Recreation Area, Frozen Head State Park, Cumberland Trail State Park, Lone Mountain State Forest, and Rugby State Natural Area – all of which embrace miles and miles of awesome hiking opportunities for all levels of hikers.

Some of the favorites include:

Point Trail, Lilly Bluff, Obed Wild & Scenic River: 3.8 miles out and back, rated moderate to strenuous.

Emory River Gorge Section, Cumberland Trail State Park: 2.6 miles out and back (starting at the Nemo Bridge parking lot) rated easy.

Gentleman's Swimming Hole / Meeting of the Waters, Big South Fork National River & Recreation Area: Rugby

Coyote Point Trail, Lone Mountain State Forest: 8.3 mile

loop, rated strenuous due to distance and elevation gain.

Judge Branch Loop / South Old Mac Trail, Frozen Head State Park: 3.2 mile loop, rated easy to moderate.

Kellogg's Crack Loop, Rugby State Natural Area: 2.85 mile loop, rated easy.





The Obed Wild & Scenic River Boulder Trail lives up to its name. This area of the Obed WSR will have you winding through a variety of hiking trails that showcase boulders, rock walls and formations. As an international destination, climbers from all over the world come to climb.





Bird watching is a very popular activity at the Obed Wild & Scenic River. Approximately 160 species of birds have been recorded within the park boundaries in the past 40 years! WOW!

Frozen Head State Park is a wildflower haven! The biodiversity of wildflowers is second, only to the great Smoky Mountains with over 100 species. Prime viewing time for wildflowers in the park is during FSP Annual Wildflower Pilgrimage, held the third weekend in April.

HUNTING & FISHING



The Obed Wild & Scenic River and Frozen Head State Park offer the best variety in fishing and hunting. The Obed allows hunting in designated areas and even offers an extended hog season. Both parks follow all TWRA state hunting rules and guidelines.

If you enjoy fishing in some of the most picturesque ponds, streams and rivers, you will love Morgan County. Many species of sportfish make these beautiful waters their home, including; Panfish, Large-mouth, Small-mouth and Rock Bass, Muskellunge (known locally as Jack Fish); three species of catfish and several species of trout. This area

also contains a huge diversity of freshwater, Mussels,
Salamanders and Crayfish - some found only here and nowhere
else in the world!
